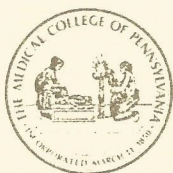

In Tribute to Dr. Marion Fay . . .

She is Philadelphia's Grande Dame of medical education.

In her 48 years at The Medical College of Pennsylvania, she has made a lasting mark as scientist, teacher, administrator, and friend. The first woman president of a medical college in the United States, Marion Spencer Fay, a native of New Orleans, became a "Distinguished Daughter of Pennsylvania," by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by the Council of the City of Philadelphia as well, for her outstanding contributions to city and state. The impact of her work at our College, however, has reached the nation and the world.

In the spring of 1981, MCP saluted Dr. Fay, after fulfilling her MCP roles of professor, dean and president, by naming the Marion Spencer Fay Research Building in her honor. Dr. Fay's portrait was hung in the Research Building Lobby, along with a plaque bearing her words, "The foundation stones are important and lasting and can never be forgotten; but you must build on them a structure of your own." The College continues to grow on the foundations built by Marion Fay.

Her sister wrote to Dr. Fay, upon leaving MCP's presidency, asking, "NOW are you coming home?" With characteristic directness, Dr. Fay replied, "I am home." The Medical College of Pennsylvania, Dr. Fay, will bear your mark forever. It will always be your home.
